GENERAL ORDER 19-1

The Executive Branch and the Legislative Branch are at an impasse regarding funding for the Third Branch, and seeing the need to make provision therefor, with the concurrence of the Bankruptcy Judges, IT IS ORDERED as follows:

- Reduced staffing levels due to budget adjustments over the past several years make it
 necessary to designate all employees of the Bankruptcy Court and Bankruptcy Clerk's
 Office as essential for the support of the exercise of the Court's constitutional judicial
 function and power.
- 2. All employees should report to work unless otherwise specifically instructed.
- 3. Travel shall be avoided, except as approved by the undersigned IN ADVANCE. All training and continuing education activities conducted by the Courts are suspended. No new personnel hires may occur and no new expenditure of funds shall be made without consent of the undersigned.
- 4. Considering the need to provide continuing judicial functions within this Court's constitutional mandate, the General Services Administration and the United States

Marshals Service are requested to maintain all functions necessary for the continued safety of courthouses and personnel in the Bankruptcy Court.

5. This order is effective until further order of the Court.
