1 2 3 4 5 UNITED STATES BANKRUPTCY COURT 6 DISTRICT OF ARIZONA 7 8 In the matter of: 9 RESTRICTIONS ON VISITORS TO THE AMENDED GENERAL ORDER 20-4 COURTHOUSE 10 11 12 Effective March 18, 2020, the Bankruptcy Court for the District of Arizona implemented 13 14 General Order 20-4, which provides as follows: The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention has advised the general public to take 15 precautions necessary to reduce the possibility of exposure to Coronavirus Disease 2019 16 (COVID-19) virus and slow the spread of the disease. The Governor of the State of Arizona has 17 declared a public health emergency throughout the state in response to the spread of COVID-19 18 in Arizona. The Court has weighed the right of the public to open access to the court against the 19 need to protect the safety of the public, including the health of all those entering and working in 20 the courthouses. 21 **Effective immediately**, the following persons are not permitted to enter the United States 22 23 Bankruptcy Court for the District of Arizona: Persons who have been diagnosed with COVID-19; 24 Persons who reside in, or have had contact with, someone who has been diagnosed 25 26 with COVID-19 within the last 14 days; Persons who, because of COVID-19, have been asked to self-quarantine by any doctor, 27 hospital, or health agency; and 28

• Persons with apparent symptoms of COVID-19, such as fever, severe cough, or shortness of breath.

Effective immediately, General Order 20-4 is amended to include the following:

 No visitor shall be admitted to the Bankruptcy Courthouses in Phoenix or Tucson without a face-covering, which shall be worn at all times while in the courthouse. Face coverings will be provided to any visitor who does not have their own. Other tenants of the courthouse or those coming to interact with such tenants shall provide their own face-covering.

These restrictions apply to anyone entering the courthouse and will remain in place until the Court determines that it is safe to remove them.
