A hearing on a creditor's competing plan of reorganization (DN 146) by KCB Custom Builders, LLC ("KCB") as to Debtor Villas at Ocotillo, LLC, Case No. 2:08-bk-06837 ("Debtor"), came on for hearing on July 28,20009. After consideration of the evidentiary record and the law, the court now issues its rulings.

MOTION TO STRIKE AND OBJECTION TO LATE FILED BALLOT OF MKA REAL ESTATE OPPORTUNITY FUND I, LLC

The evidence was undisputed that MKA Real Estate Opportunity Fund I, LLC ("MKA") filed its rejecting ballot late. No excuse or reason for doing so was proffered in any manner. The motion to strike (DN 192) is therefore, GRANTED, and MKA's vote is disqualified for voting purposes.

CONFIRMATION OF KCB'S COMPETING PLAN

KCB presented evidence in support of its competing creditor's plan, and was cross-examined. Only one written objection was filed, that by Nikor Enterprises, Inc. ("Nikor") (DN 188).

The court finds that concludes that KCB's plan meets each of the relevant criteria of 11 U.S.C. § 1129(a). As a liquidation plan, the court finds that the \$110,000 cash contribution, together with the subordination of a \$680,000 claim against the Debtor, results in creditors realizing more under the plan that they would otherwise received in a Chapter 7 liquidation. § 1127(a)(7). The opposing creditors maintain that the court should reject this tangible offer in favor of recently-filed state court litigation. However, no evidence was tendered to support the merits of that litigation, assess the probable recoveries, if any, nor weigh the risks and cost benefit of such litigation. No attorney or expert witness was tendered to provide evidence as to the merits of such suit. Therefore, the record is clear that this plan passes the "best interests of creditors" test.

The court also expressly finds KCB's plan to have been presented in good faith, and that it complies with the Bankruptcy Code. § 1129(a)(1)(2) and (3).

An impartial disbursing agent for all of the estate's cash assets is to be Daniel P. Collins ("Disbursing Agent"), who shall serve without bond, provided that all of the estate's assets are maintained in a separate interest-bearing bank account, and in a banking institution agreeable to the U.S. Trustee's Office. Mr. Collins shall file quarterly reports with the court, serving copies thereof upon the principal parties and the U.S. Trustee, reporting activity within the account. At the

conclusion of his responsibilities, Mr. Collins should file a Final Account and Report, and KCB 1 2 shall seek a Final Decree. Mr. Collins' reasonable costs and fees may be paid from the account. 3 The proponent, KCB, has the vote of at least one impaired consenting class. The court further finds that the plan is feasible. 11 U.S.C. § 1129(a)(11). 4 5 Counsel for KCB shall: 6 7 1. Lodge an order of confirmation; 8 2. Begin the process (with the Debtor's cooperation) of filing objections 9 to any claims that are undeserving (in whole or in part) of payment 10 under the plan. 11 3. Work with the Disbursing Agent to distribute the funds in accordance 12 with the priorities established by the Bankruptcy Code; 4. 13 File such reports as are required by the U.S. Trustee, in a timely fashion; 14 5. 15 Move to close the estate, once a Final Decree has been entered; Gather and solicit all outstanding administrative claims, and cause the 16 6. 17 same to be set for hearing (if needed); or notice such applications out 18 on a "negative notice" basis; and 19 7. Take such other and further steps as are required and/or are necessary 20 to conclude the administration of this estate as soon as possible. 21 22 Finally, it will be the court's ruling that the objection to the plan filed by Nikor is 23 OVERRULED. 24 25 DATED AND SIGNED ABOVE. 26 27

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
